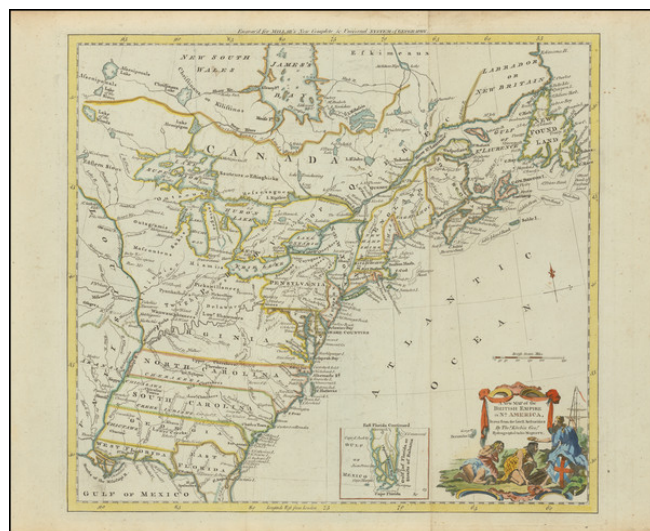

Striking Revolutionary War period map of the British Colonies in North America.

The map covers the region east of the Mississippi River and from James Bay to the Gulf of Mexico, showing the provinces and colonies, towns and cities, Indian villages and tribal territory, along with mines, forts and other points of interest.

Ft. Pontchartrain is shown in Michigan, with Kitchigamin Lake is shown, the origins for Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's "Hiawatha" poem (1855), (Gitche Gumee, meaning the Big-Sea-Water).

An inset depicts southern Florida as a vast group of islands. The Carolinas and Georgia extend to the Mississippi River.
