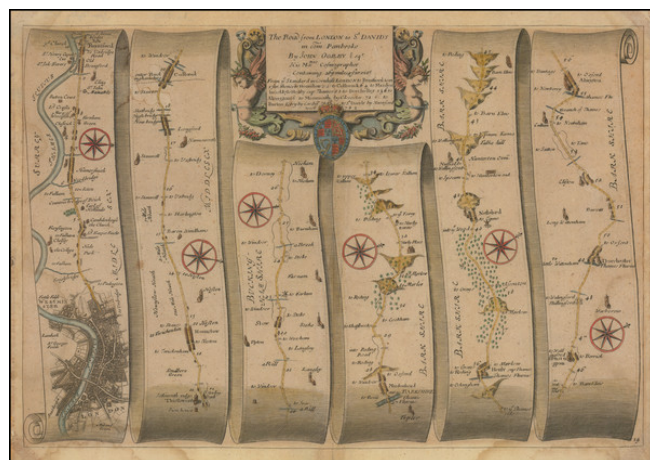

London to Oxford Exurbs

Nice example of John Ogilby's road map showing a portion of the road from London to the west, to the just southeast of Oxford.

The map extends from London to Hammersmith, Hounslow, Slough, Maidenhead, Nettlebed, Warborough, Clifton Hamden and Abingdon.

Ogilby's strip maps are among the most interesting and recognizable maps available to map collectors. The distinctive scroll style was a graphic innovation which would be repeated by other map makers for over 100 years. The map begins in Bramyard and continues through Leominster and Prestaine, to the Aberystwyth on the Irish Sea. Each strip includes a compass rose, mileage details and other information, including rivers, mountains, forests, etc.

John Ogilby (1600- 1676) was a Scottish translator, impresario and cartographer. He is known best for his *Britannia Atlas* of 1675, which was perhaps the first British road atlas.
