

Marvelous regional map, extending from Port George and Cape San Sebastian to just south of Soledad Mission and Monterey, and centered on San Francisco, with a large depiction of the Bay.

One of the few regional maps of California to focus on this section of the coast of Calfironia during the 1820s and by far the largest format.

The most detailed regional map of the period. Over a dozen place names. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. His treatment of the Western US is a landmark in the history of the cartography of the Western US, undertaking to map in 20 sheets, a region which American publishers were virtually ignoring.
