

## **Description:**

Highly detailed map of the Northwestern US, from a scarce edition of Colton's New General Atlas.

Cassia County is shown in Idaho (established 1879). Early results of the General Land Office Surveys appear.

This map is one of the best regional maps of the period, showing remarkable Indian detail, early forts, explorer's routes, mining information and a wonderful look at the evolving geographical knowledge of the region. Following the end of the Civil War, this region was explored again in earnest, and with substantial new information being added north of the Wind River Range. Many early Indian Resevations noted. Gold regions are noted. A terrific early map, one of the few regional maps to appear in a commercial atlas.
