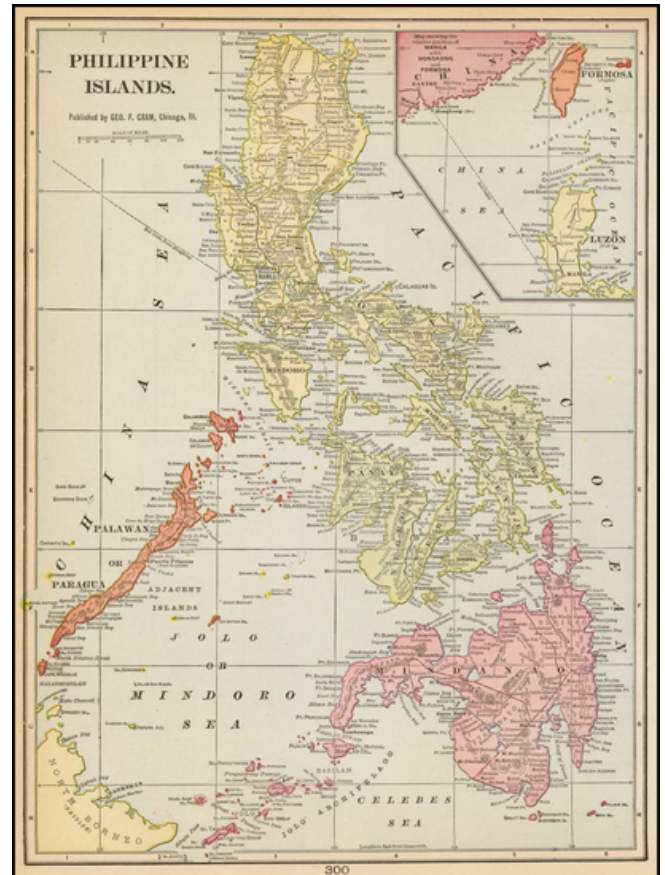

Detailed map of Philippines, with a large inset showing the area between northern Luzon and China (including Hong Kong).

The Sub Cable from Hong Kong to Manila is shown. The Eastern Extension laid its first International submarine cable between the Philippines and Hong Kong in 1880. The cable was laid by the cable ship *Calabaria*. It took over four months to do and was completed on May 2, 1880. The cable stretched 535 nautical miles from Hong Kong to Bolinao, Pangasinan. From Bolinao, it was extended via a 160-mile landline to Manila.
