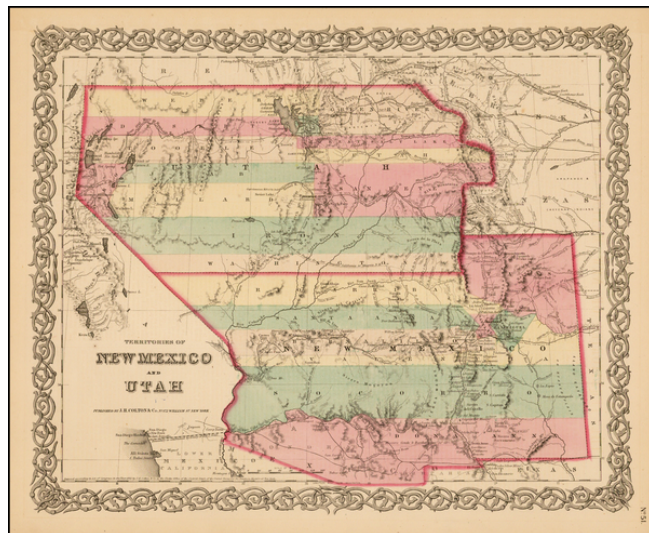

Description:

Gorgeous example of Colton's New Mexico and Utah Territories map. A cornerstone map, exceptionally detailed and showing Fremont's 1844 and 1845 routes, the Spanish trail from Los Angeles to New Mexico, Kearney's Route, Col. Washington's Expedition, the Cimarron Route and the location where Capt. Gunnison was ambushed by the Ute Indians.

Locates numerous forts, roads, Indian information, the proposed route for the Pacific RR, and a host of early geographical features, including several rarely referenced river sinks and other features in Nevada.

At least 5 counties cross the map from California to the Rockies and beyond. The map is from the first edition of JH Colton's Atlas and features wide margins.
