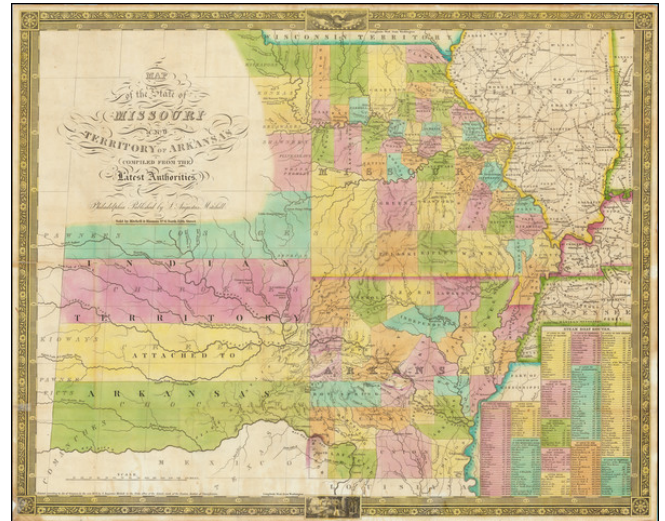

### Description:

Early edition of Mitchell's separate map of Missouri and Arkansas Territory.

The map shows a double wide Arkansas with its newly truncated border, with Indian Territory attached to Arkansas named in what will become part of Oklahoma. Numerous Indian tribes are identified in this region.

This map was likely issued at about the same time Arkansas became a state in May 1836, although the formal split between Arkansas Territory and the region labeled as Indian Territory began in 1824 and 1826.

The full area shown includes Missouri, Indian Territory, Arkansas Territory, and parts of Texas, Louisiana, Tennessee, Kentucky, and Illinois. This was the first state of the map to name Texas.

The following Indian Tribal regions are located, a vestige of the Indian Removal Act of 1830, which relocated these tribes into this region:

- Kickapoo
- Konzas
- Delaware
- Shawnee
- Piankashaws

The history of the map begins when it was first published in 1826 by Anthony Finley, under the title *Map of the State of Missouri and Territory of Arkansas Compiled from the Latest Authorities*. The map appeared in several editions, including 1826, 1831 (the first Mitchell edition) and 1836.
