

## **Description:**

### **Rocky Mountains & Plains**

Excellent early map of Rocky Mountains and Plains, from the 1867 edition of Mitchell's New General Atlas.

The future Wyoming Territory, formed by the *Wyoming Organic Act* on July 25, 1868, is shown as "Attached to Dacota."

Kansas counties cover only the eastern third of the state. Nebraska counties cover less than half the state. Colorado has only approximately 15 counties. The gold regions near Denver are shown, as are a number of Indian Tribes, early towns, forts, etc.

The map shows early proposed railroads, forts, Indian tribes, rivers, mountains, etc. The plains region is still very much in transition, with the results of several major explorations commenced immediately after the civil war are not yet in evidence.

Also shows portions of New Mexico, Texas and Indian Territory.
