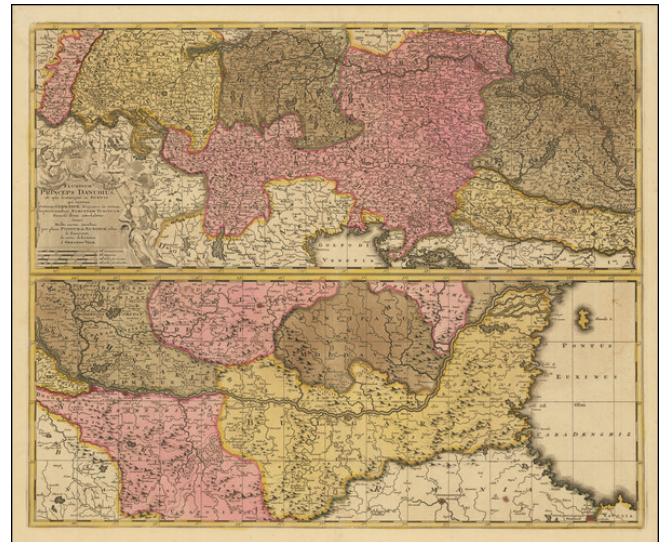

***Antique Map of the Course of the Danube***

Finely executed map of the region drained by the Danube River, published by Gerard Valk in Amsterdam near the end of the 17th century.

The map begins with the sources of the Danube northwest of the Bodensee and extends in two sections to the Black Sea.

The Danube, at the time, flowed through the regions controlled by the Holy Roman Empire and the Ottoman Empire. The river was one of the most important in the world in this time period.
