

Scarce large format map of England and Wales, published by G.F. Cruchley in 1840.

This is one of the largest and most detailed wall maps of England and Wales from the middle of the 19th Century.

Originally published in 1813, the map was reissued in 1820, when Arrowsmith became 'Hydrographer to the King', when George IV became king instead of Prince Regent and later by Cruchley.
