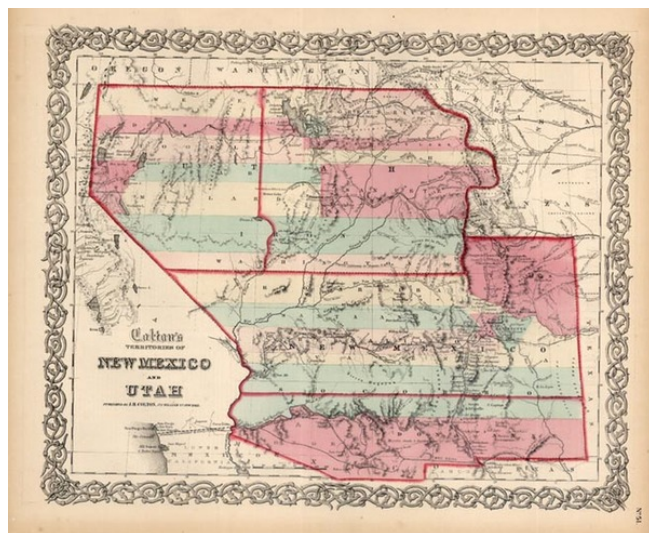

Description:

A flawless example of this sought after edition of Colton's map of the Southwest, issued in the rare 1860 edition of Colton's Atlas. This is the only regional map to appear in an American Atlas to show Colona, the early territorial named for Colorado Territory. In addition, Arizona appears below New Mexico and an early ephemeral appearance of Nevada appears, although not including its southern tip and pushed considerably west of its final border with Utah. Massive territorial counties stretch from California to Texas and the Rocky Mountains. Early explorers notes and routes are shown, including nice details on Conde & Bartlett's line, predating the Gadsden Purchase, Kearny's Route, the Early US Mail Routes, Fremont's Route, Gunnison's Route, Stansbury's Route, the place where Gunnison was killed by Indians, Washington's Expedition, etc. Also shows forts and Military Posts. One of the scarcest and most sought after of all maps of the region in remarkable wash color. Brown, State7.
