Scarce and highly detailed chart of Cuba, published by the Spanish Government in Madrid. This example is laid on the original linen and rolled, and includes extensive pencil notations around Havana, from a contemporary hand. This was clearly a working chart and is in unusually fine condition for something that was almost certainly used at sea. Spanish maps of the Caribbean are quite scarce, even in the 19th Century. Extends from Cape San Antonio at the western tip of the island to the Rio Siguagua and Cape Piedras in the Northeast and Ensenada de Cochinas in the Southeast. Includes Havana. A clean fresh example, with the linen also in near flawless condition.
