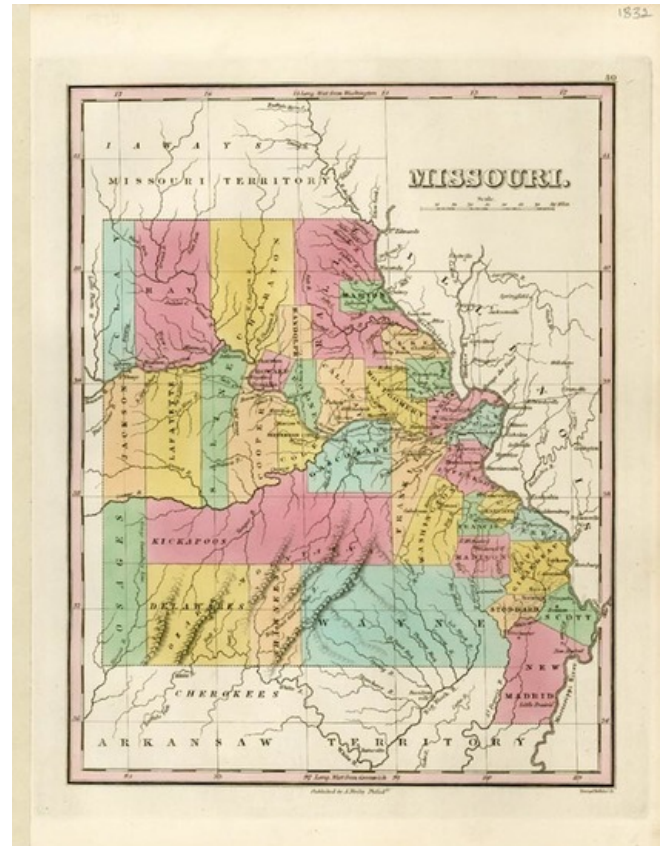

Description:

Flawless example of this late state of Finley's map of Missouri, colored by counties and showing towns, rivers, mountains and other geographical features. One of the earliest obtainable maps of Missouri, with virtually none of the counties in its modern configuration. The majority of counties are contiguous to the Mississippi or Missouri Rivers, with massive Gasconade and Wayne Counties in the South, and Clay, Ray, Rallis and Charaton counties in the North. Most of the information about towns and topography is also contiguous to these rivers. Since the first edition, a number of new Indian Regions have been added, including Osages, Delawares, Shawnees, Kickapoos, etc. Jackson, Lafayette, Marion and Randolph Counties have all been created and Gaconade has significantly shrunk. Gorgeous example of this rare late state.
