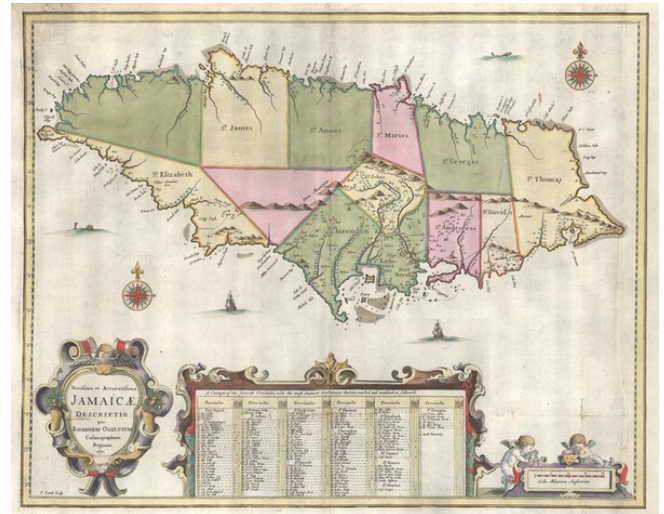

Description:

Ogilby's rare map of Jamaica is the first English map of the Colony. The map was included only in the late editions of Ogilby's America and, because of its size, rarely survives in good condition. The map is hand colored by Precincts, and includes an elaborate table showing the names of the land owners and the various crops which they were producing (cocoa, indigo, sugar and cotton). Highly detailed. Includes decorative cartouches, 2 compass roses, sea monsters and sailing ships. The right side of the map has been restored one inch into the printed image and the upper left corner also includes a small area of facsimile work. In all, a decorative and very presentable example of this rare maps.
