The map was bound into Volume IV of William Gordon's *THE HISTORY OF THE RISE, PROGRESS, AND ESTABLISHMENT OF THE INDEPENDENCE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA...* published in London in 1788. The map was engraved by Thomas Conder, although Verner comments that the map is drawn from the Fry Jefferson map. Includes numerous roads, counties, towns, rivers, court houses, islands, and other contemporary Revolutionary War information. A fine example in attractive color. The map appeared in Dr. Gordon's *History of the American War*, one of the best contemporary British Accounts of the Revolution.
