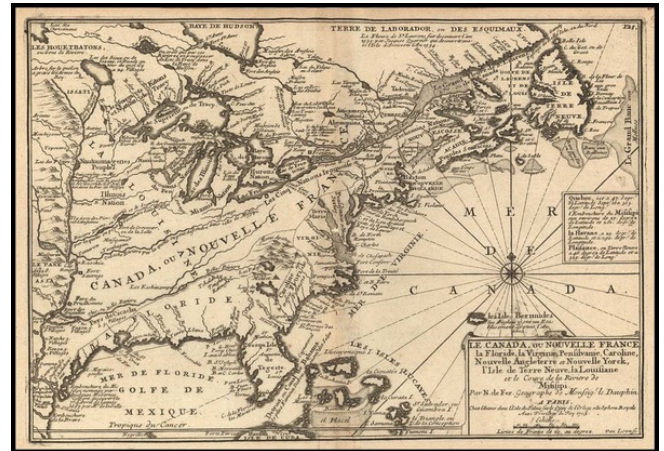

Description:

Fine dark impression of this marvelous map by De Fer from his Atlas Curieux. The course of the Mississippi is virtually due North, originating in Texas and extending into Canada. The many rivers which feed the Mississippi are described and often annotated, most notably the Ohio ou Bell Riviere, which starts far south of its true origins and the Oubache River. The extend of Canada ou Nouvelle France is extended far to the south and the size of the English Colonies substantially reduced, undoubtedly a political statement. Notes on early explorations, forts, rivers and Indian Tribes abound in this marvelous work, engraved by van Loon. One of the best regional maps of the era from a less than folio sized work.
