

## **Description:**

Scarce map of North America, shortly after the Louisiana Purchase and the first publication of Lewis & Clark's official report. Includes the rare pre-Louisiana Purchase territories, including St. Louis, Arkansas and Lawrence.

Massive Russian America. Mythical rivers of the west, flowing from the Salt Lake Region to the Pacific. Texas is named. Excellent post-Lewis & Clark details west of the Missouri. Fascinating conjectural connection of the Yellowstone River to the Columbia River, showing a potential water course from the Missouri to the Pacific Ocean (yes, they had not yet given up!). Many Indian Tribes named. A terrific example of this scarce map.
