Rare pair of maps on a single sheet, illustrating the Straits of Magellan and the unknown Southern Continent.

The map is divided into two sections. The top half is drawn on normal projection and shows the bottom of South America, separated by a strait from a large Southland (Australis Terre Pars). The naming of C. Della Victoria and the illustration of Magellan's ship the Victoria indicates Magellan's discovery of the strait that now bears his name. The south section is drawn on polar projection and shows a large Terra Australis reaching up in four peninsulas towards New Guinea (here shown as an island), 'Java Maior', Africa and towards South America. On the Southland just below 'Java Maior' are indicated three place names - *Maletur Regnum*, *Beach* (based upon Marco Polo's Account) and *Lucach Regnum*.
