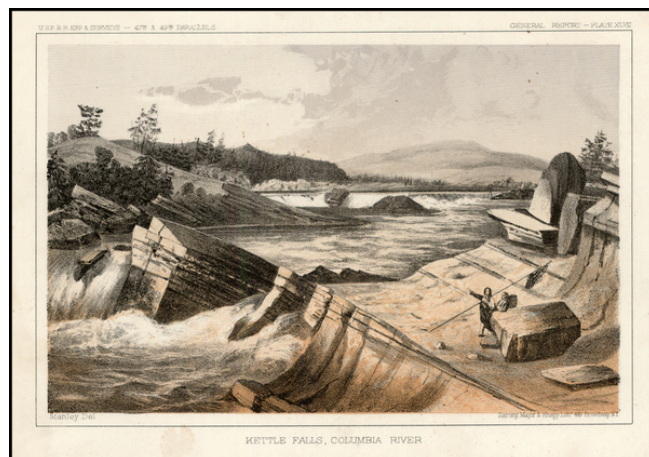

These consist of two pitches, one of fifteen feet and another below it of ten, and the river is narrowed to two hundred yards
