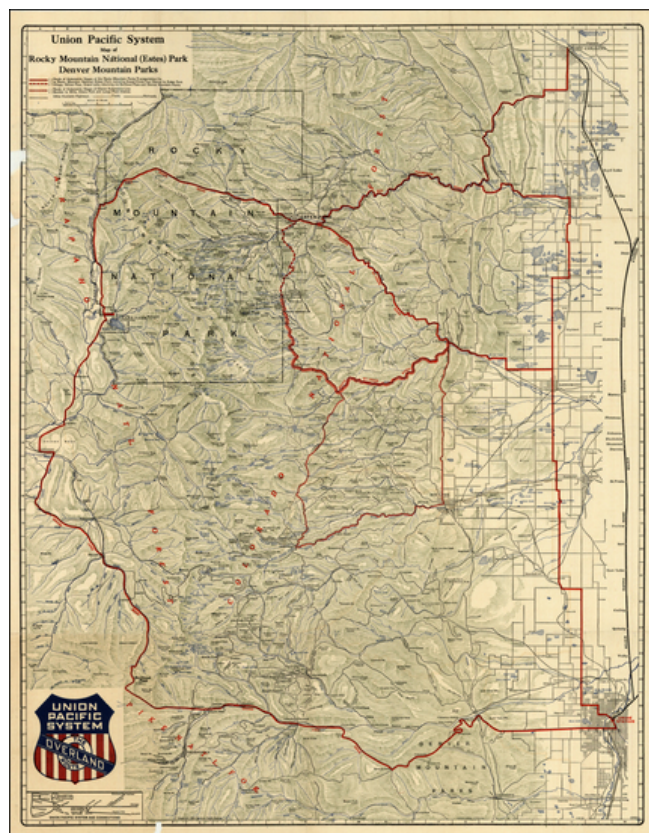

Description:

Fascinating early Union Pacific Railroad promotional map for Estes Park and the Rocky Mountain region west of Denver and Fort Collins, primarily promoting the available automobile routes in the region.

The import of the map is the Union Pacific's promotion of rail travel to Denver as a means of seeing the Rocky Mountains by car, as the main lines in red promote the available scenic and historic driving routes through the region. The map is reflective of the beginning of America's romance with the automobile and the era of "Over Loving" the US national parks, which resulted in a boom in commercial exploitation and over development of the park system.

Maps such as this provide a marvelous ephemeral look at the use and development of the region and often reflect roads and commercial uses (hotels, tourist attractions, etc.) which were later closed and abandoned as the management of the park system evolved away from tourist uses and became increasingly focused



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on the preservation and conservation of the natural resource element of the parks.
