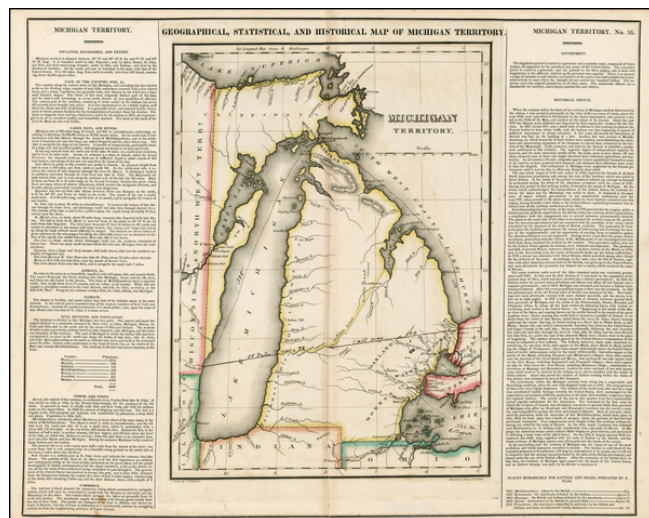

Nice example of the 1823 edition of Carey & Lea's map of Michigan, the first map of Michigan Territory.

Virtually no settlements in the interior and the upper peninsula, with most of the towns concentrated on the southeast border. The remainder is Indian Territory, w/notes on Portages. Includes Indian Settlements, and a few early counties, including Monroe, Oakland, DeWayne and Macomb. Early roads shown and some settlements on Lake St. Claire and Lake Erie, along with Ft Brown and Camp Smith south of Green Bay. Text around the map describes the Topography, Climate, Animals, Civil Divisions, Population, Towns & Forts, Government, History and remarkable battles fought in Michigan to date.

Interesting manuscript annotation seems to be plotting the course of a future railway.
