

## **Description:**

Striking example of the first edition / first state of De Vaugondy's edition of the seminal Fry-Jefferson map.

A well executed reduction of the famous 4 sheet map of the region, which was originally issued separately and later appeared in Jefferys' *American Atlas*. The result is a beautiful single folio sheet example of the most sought after and recognizeable 18th Century map of Virginia and Maryland. While the title is in French, virtually the entire map is English. The map provides a fabulously detailed look into prerevolutionary war Virginia and Maryland, extending west to the Alleghany Mountains, and including Delaware and a portion of New Jersey, as well as the region around Philadelphia.

This is state one of the first edition, showing the Lord Fairfax Grant line, which extended west from the line connecting the Rappohanock and Potomac Rivers. All subsequent states do not show this line, although in the early states, the date of the map is unchanged.
