Highly detailed map of all the Baltic, Poland, and part of Russia, published by Covens & Mortier, after the original of 1703 by Guillaume De L'Isle.

The map is colored by provinces, at the height of Poland's territorial reach. Extends from the Balck Sea to the Estates of the Czar and from Presburg and Bresla to Pomerania, centered on Pinsk and Minsk.

The French title references the map sources as Simon Starovolski, whose first atlas of Poland was published in 1720; Le Vasseur de Beauplan, a Norman engineer who served the King of Poland during the 17th century; Christopher Hartknoch, author of a map of Prussia, 1684 and Johannes Hevelius (1611 - 1687), the famous Polish astronomer and geographer.
