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

Fine example of De Fer's map of Peru and contiguous parts of the Andes and Upper Amazon River Basin.

The striking large format map is the result of the some of the most up to date cartographic information coming back to Europe from the the Jesuit Missionaries who were then actively working to convert the indigenous peoples of South America to Christianity.

The map includes parts of present-day Ecuador, Bolivia, and Brazil. Cartographic elements include location of native American settlements, rivers, lakes, and wetlands, some topographical details, compass rose, and degrees of latitude and longitude. Decorative cartouche includes llamas, scene of mining with miners carrying baskets on their backs and climbing ladders. Also includes native American man and woman with spear, shield, and basket.
