

Description:

Early regional map of the region bounded by Peru and Columbia in the west to Venezuela and part of Lago De Parime in the east, covering the Dutch Antilles, Trinidad, Tobago, S. Vincente S. Lucia, etc. Nice coverage of the Orinoco River. The map covers the region which would become New Granada under Simon Bolivar, 150 years later, but is still controlled by the Spanish, who at the time were developing the region, especially around Quito, for its vast mineral resources. Many major cities appear, as do rivers, lakes, mountains, islands and other details. One of the earliest obtainable regional maps of this area. From the 1662 edition of Sanson's *L'Amerique en Plusieurs Cartes Nouvelles...* the third atlas to focus solely upon America.
