

Includes an early explorer's tracks in the region.

Shows soundings and various routes through the region. A highly detailed and interesting map. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. A bit of spotting and soiling, but overall a nice map.
