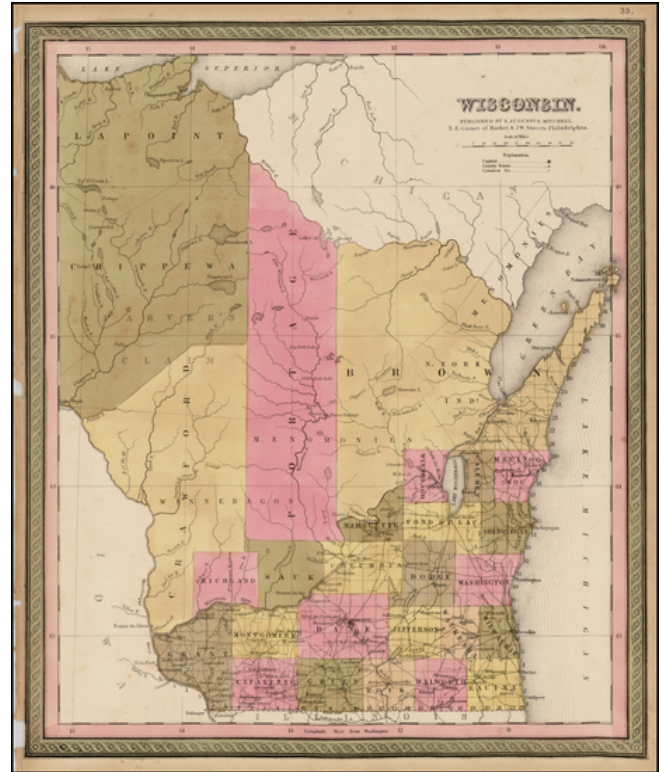

Description:

Fascinating early map of Wisconsin, issued 11 years after it first became a territory.

The lands south of the Wisconsin and Fox Rivers are largely surveyed and many early counties, towns, etc. appear. The region to the north is dominated LaPoint, Chipewa, Crawford, Portage and Brown Counties. Brown County had previously been attached to Michigan and was much smaller in the preceding years. Portage, Chipewa and Lapoint are just established and did not appear on prior Mitchell maps. These lands were previously the lands of the Winnebagos, Menomonies, Oneidas, Sioux and Chippewa. Massive Carver claim remains, now nearly 100 years old. The south is filled with roads, and towns, the north rivers, portages, etc.
