

Striking full color example of D'Anville's map of the Beijing Province, from Du Halde's *Nouvel atlas de la Chine, de la Tartarie chinoise et du Thibet*.

The map shows Peking (Bejing) and and extended portion of the Great Wall of China, along with a gorgeous allegorical cartouche, with two dragons, a smaller winged dragon and other embellishments. D'Anville used maps prepared by Jesuit missionaries and commissioned by Emporer-Kanyx, who in 1708-16 ordered a surveying of the country.

This map was the first accurate cartographic depiction of this part of China to be published in the west.
