

Description:

Highly detailed regional map of part of South Australia, including Kangaroo Island, the Gulf of St. Vincent, Spencer Gulf, Encounter Bay and Nuyts Archipelago. The map pre-dates the establishment of Adelaide. The primary features of the map are the numerous mountains (named and unnamed), including M. Arden, M. Brown, M. Young, du Milieu, Mt. Lofty, etc. A number of Bays, Points and Islands are also illustrated and named. The eastern portion of the map discusses the coastal mountain ranges and their passability. A few stray wormholes, but generally in obtrusive. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
