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

Description:

Finely detailed separately issued sea chart of Bermuda, with a large inset plan of St. George Harbour, first published by the British Admiralty in London in 1877.

The inset of St. George's Harbour is of particular note, one of the largest and most detailed depictions of the Harbor and environs published in the 19th Century. The Harbor, St. George Island, Smith Island and St. David Island are depicted in fine detail, as is the Ship Channel from Murray Anchorage.

Several lighthouses are depicted. The soundings (in fathoms) around the island are remarkably detailed.

The Chart includes a paste down label for Edward Stanford, London's leading map seller in 2nd half of the 19th Century.

Detailed Condition:
