

Fine example of the US Geological Survey's Topographical Map of Rocky Mountain National Park, first issued in 1919.

The present map is based upon surveys conducted between 1912 and 1915 and provides an early detailed topographical depiction of Rocky Mountain National Park, utilizing 100 foot contour lines. The Legend at the right side of the map notes the key by which the following are identified:

- Figures (heights of mountains, etc.)
