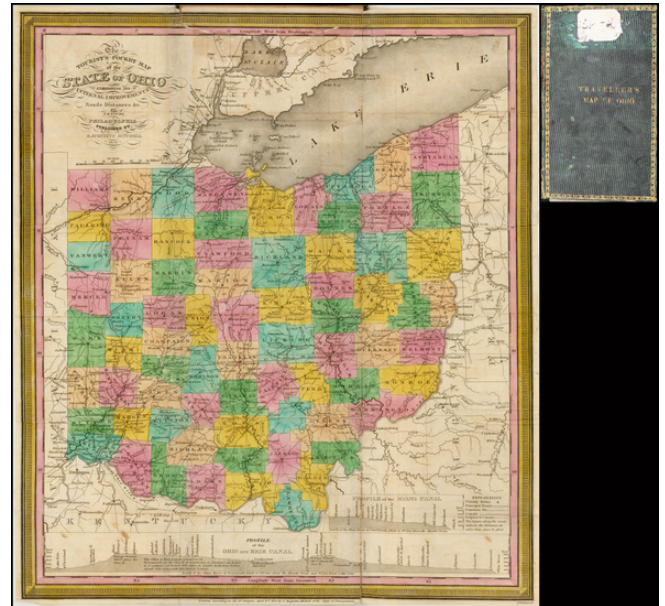

The map is colored by counties and shows, roads, railroads, towns, distances and a profile of the Erie Canal, several other proposed railroads and canals, and some interesting historical details, including the Harris Line surveyed in 1817, and Fulton's Line surveyed in 1814.
