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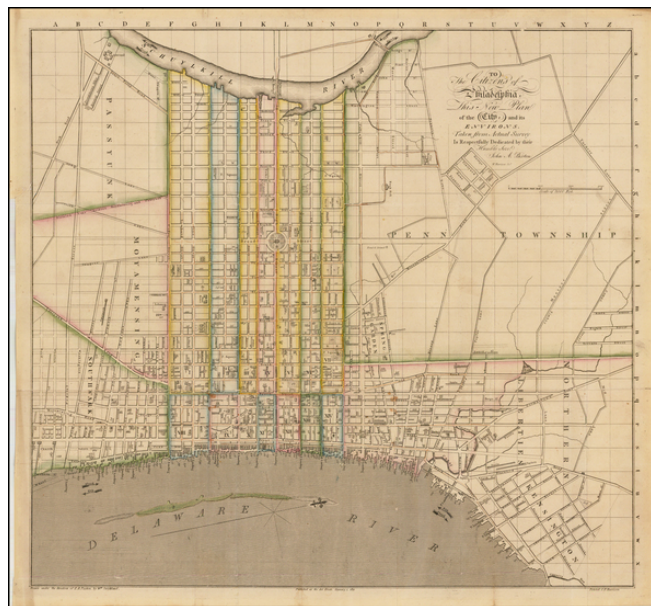

The map shows West at the top and provides a very different treatment of the City, when compared to predecessor plans such as Charles Varle's map of 1795.
