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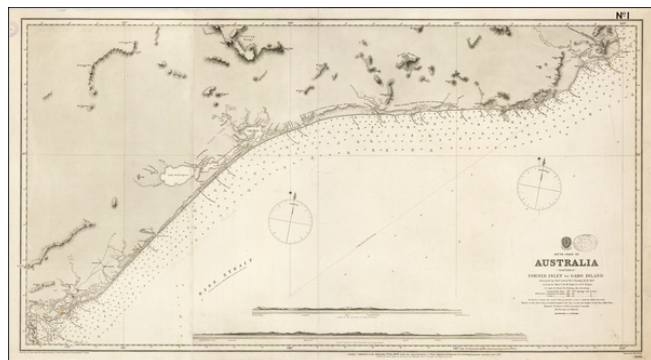

Description:

First State of this scarce working sea chart of the Victoria Coastline, to the northeast of Melbourne, published by the British Admiralty.

The chart starts at the border between New South Wales and Victoria, near Cape Howe and Gabo Island, and extends southwest to Corner Inlet and the North part of Wilson's Promontory National Park, covering the Bass Strait, with two large profile views.

The coast is charted with a series of 5 bathymetric soundings at various distances from the shoreline. Some topographical details are shown in the interior, including the heights of a number of mountains and notes locating Lake Wellington, Lake Victoria, Lake King, and the Gipp Land Lakes. Other annotations include "Broken and densely timbered country about 200 (and 300) feet high".

Only two lighthouses are noted in the entire stretch.
