



Striking map of the state of Indiana from Finley's New American Atlas, colored by counties and showing towns, roads, rivers, mountains and other geographical features.

Only the southern counties remotely resemble their final configuration. Most of the northern portion of the territory is Indian lands. A number of new counties have been established since the 1824 edition of the map, but Carroll, Tippecanoe, Warren, Wabash, Madison, Delaware and others in the north central part of the state are still not shown.

One of the earliest obtainable maps of Indiana, at a period of accelerated exploration and settlement in the state.
