Rare unauthorized English Edition Wagenhaer's map of Swedish and Danish coastlines -- Southwestern Jutland Coastline

The map extends from the Isle of Sylt and Tonder in the south to the South part of Ringkobing Fjord.

The English map is a copy of the first state of Waghenaeer's sea chart of the same region, first published in 1588. Waghenaeer's *Spiegel* was the first engraved sea atlas.

Lucas Janszoon Waghenaeer (c. 1533-1606) was a Dutch marine cartographer and navigator. He grew up in the important port of Enkhuizen. From 1550-1579 he served at sea, increasing his practical knowledge of sailing and charting. His first publication was the famous *Spiegel der Zeevaert*, or *Mariner's Mirror*, which appeared in 1584. The work was reprinted and translated into several European languages. The combination of detailed charts accompanied by sailing directions set a precedent and model for subsequent sea atlases, which came to be called waggoners. Waghenaeer published two other works, *Thresoor der Zeevaert* (*Treasure of navigation*) in 1592 and the *Enchuyser zeecaertboek* (*Enkhuizen sea-chart-book*) in 1598. He died in 1606.

Originally engraved by Joannes Doetecum, the English edition was engraved by Jodocus Hondius, one of the earliest maps engraved by Hondius.
