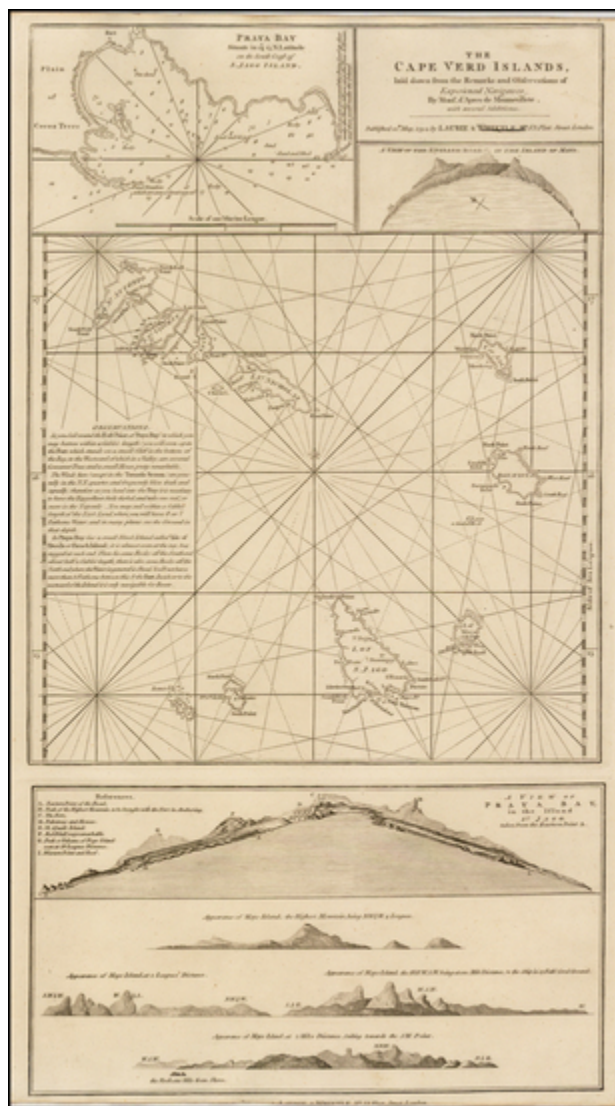

This sheet of sea charts details the Cape Verde Islands. First settled by the Portuguese in 1462, it soon became a popular haunt for pirates, including Sir Francis Drake in the 1580s.



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The sheet features with inset maps of Praya Bay, A View of the English Road, A View of Praya Bay and a group of recognition views. Sayer and Bennet based their work on charts by Jean-Baptiste Mannevilletes's *Le Neptune Oriental* (Paris, 1745).
