## **Description:**

Good example of Braun & Hogenberg's view of Bilbao.

The view shows Bilbao from the southeast; in the distance the town of Portugalete can be seen on the estuary of the Nervion in the Bay of Biscay. Diego López V de Haro founded Bilbao on 15 June 1300. The bay known as Ria cuts deep into the land and links Bilbao with the Gulf of Biscay via Portugalete. It is navigable due to its depth, which made it possible to build a harbour in Bilbao that offered far better protection than coastal harbours, and led to the town becoming one of Castile's trade centres; in particular, Merino wool was exported to northern Europe from here. The church of San Anton adjoins the San Anton bridge (on the right). The Gothic cathedral of Santiago is visible in the middle of the city.
