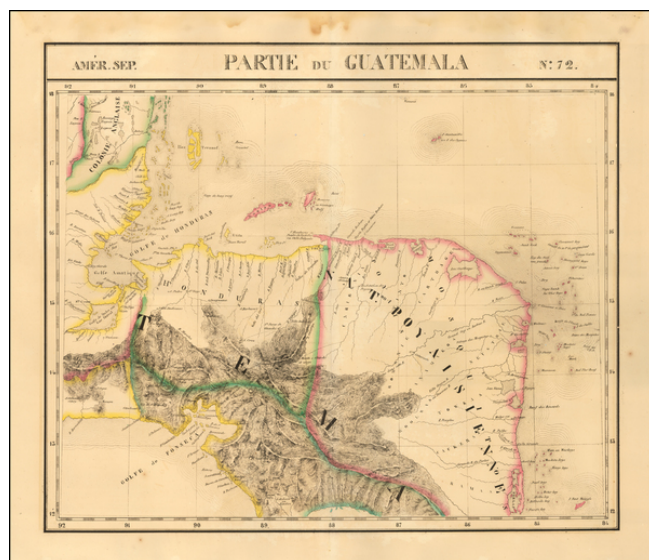

Description:

Highly detailed regional map, extending from Lac de Nicaragua, Pt. Desolada, Granada, La Taen and Blewfields in the north to B. de Honda, I. Contreras and Quibo Islands in the South and Boca del Tero and I. De Chiriqui in the east.

Includes I. Gd. Mangle or Corn Island. Well over 100 place names shown. One of the most interesting and detailed regional Commercial Atlas maps of the period. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. His treatment of the Western US is a landmark in the history the cartography of the Western US, undertaking to map in 20 sheets a region which American publishers were virtually ignoring. A fine unfolded and probably separately issued example of this pair of maps covering the Baja.
