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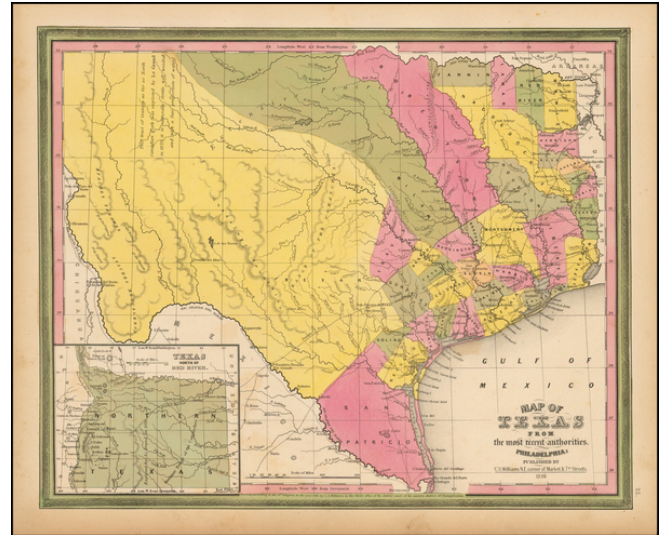
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Map of Texas From the most recent authorities . . . 1846

Detailed map of Texas, from an early edition of Mitchell's *Universal Atlas*.

Approximately 50 counties are shown and separately hand colored, although the western 2/3rds of Texas is dominated by Bexar, Milam, Robertson and San Patricio Counties. Fort Alamo is shown, along with a few dozen other place names. About 15 early roads are shown.

Large inset shows Texas North of the Red River. There are several recently added counties which were not present when HS Tanner sold the rights to this map plate to Mitchell in 1846.
