

Fine example of Reid's map of Pennsylvania, the second earliest folio atlas map of Pennsylvania printed in America.

This map includes the Erie triangle north of the 42nd parallel though evidence of an earlier erasure along the 42nd parallel suggests that the map was originally engraved by J.T. Scott (see Wheat & Brun 438).

Reid follows the work of Mathew Carey for much of the content of this map.

From Reid's American Atlas, the second Atlas published in America and the first in New York.
