Fine example of the second state of Jansson's map of the Southern tip of South America.

The map depicts a relatively simple and direct (if quite narrow) passage through Magellan's Straits, separating the Kingdom of Patagonia from Magellanica, with the southern coastline of Magellanica named Tierra del Fuego.

The map is richly embellished with a number of indigenous people and creatures, real and imagined. Le Maire's Strait is named, as is Staten Island.

The first state of this map includes a blank dedication cartouche and lacks the vignettes in Magellanica. In this second state, the dedication is completed, as are the decorative vignettes.
