

Rare first edition of Sayer & Bennett's sea chart of the coast of Southern Africa, first published in November 1781.

The first edition, pre-dates the addition of the tracks of the *Worchester* under the direction of Captain Hall in 1786, which was issued in about 1788, with a different title "A New

The map includes three insets, including:

- A Plan of Salhanha Bay geometrically surveyed in 1752
- A Plan of Dalagoa Bay called by the Portuguese Bahia de Lorenzo Marques, and by the French Baye
