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

The map provides a tremendous and highly detailed region of the lands traversed by Lewis & Clark only a decade after the official map of the Lewis & Clark expedition was first published in Philadelphia. The river and mountain systems in the region are covered with tremendous detail, as is the illustration of the Indian villages in the region. Extensive annotations in French throughout the map. The populations of several Indian tribes are also given.

A truly remarkable and highly detailed map. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
