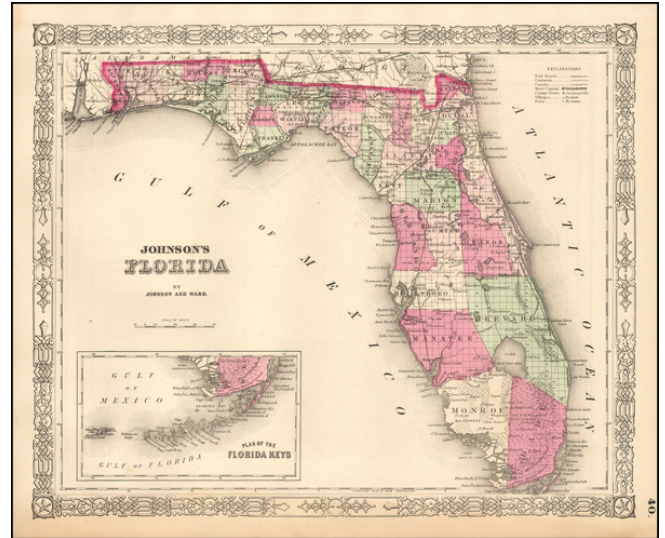

Fine early map of Florida, hand colored by county, with a large inset of the Florida Keys.

Shows towns, railroads, villages, post offices, forts, etc.

Only 5 counties shown in the southern part of Florida, including Dade, Monroe, Brevard, Manatee and Hillsboro. Early appearance of Miami. Indian hunting grounds noted in between Ft. Poinsett and Key Biscayne Bay. Many early forts appear. The GLO surveys are not yet complete in the Everglades and elsewhere.

From an early edition of Johnson's *Family Illustrated Atlas*, one of the most popular American atlases in the second half of the 19th century.
