

A British Rare Sea Chart of the Savannah River

Rare Separately Published British Admiralty Chart of the Savannah River, published in London in 1861.

The chart is likely based upon the United States Coast Survey charting of the region in 1855.

The map extends from the area just northwest of Argyle Island to the mouth of the river as it meets the Atlantic, with extensive soundings and other navigational aids and details throughout.

A detailed grid is shown for the town of Savannah, with other land divisions showing on Hutchinson Island and on either side of the River, to the south end of Argyle Island and to the Fort Jackson area in the southeast. A number of light houses are shown and named, as is Stoddard's House on Daufuskie island, Mongans House on Turtle Island, Fort Jackson, etc.
