

## **Description:**

Early large format map of the Puget Sound and Vancouver Island areas and regions to the east.

The map shows the Straits of Juan de Fuca and Cap Flattery, Bellingham Bay, Deception Passage, Pt. Forbes, Newdungeness, etc. The detail in and around Vancouver Island is remarkable. Extends north to the Straits of Queen Charlotte, Iles De la Princesse, Canna Hinchinbrook and Canal Gadner. The map tracks MacKenzie's Route to the Pacific from the Frasier River, which forms the center of the map. In the east, numerous Indian Tribes are shown, including the Kootanie, Aahoohanoo, Sayalpee, Tetes Plates, and the Serpens (Snake). The region includes many English Forts. Mt Olympia is shown, among others. The headwaters of the Columbia and Flathead Rivers are shown.

A truly remarkable and highly detailed map. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale.
