

## **Description:**

Highly detailed regional map, extending from west of Behring's Bay (Yakatut Bay) and Mount Fairweather to just south of Ketchican, including Port Seduction, Cape Spencer, Port Snettisham, Prince Frederick Sound, Chatham Straits, Cape Ommaney, King George Island, and modern day Juneau, Skagway, Ft. Wrangel, Loring, Ketchikan, Sitka, Douglas, Klawock, etc. Perhaps the most detailed map of this region during the Russian period. A nice example of this striking map. From Vandermaelen's remarkable 6 volume atlas, which if combined as globe gores forms an immense globe. Vandermaelen accomplished the first atlas mapping of the world on a uniform scale. His treatment of the Western US is a landmark in the history the cartography of the Western US, undertaking to map in 20 sheets a region which American publishers were virtually ignoring. A fine unfolded and probably separately issued example of this pair of maps covering the Baja.
