

The map is dedicated to Captain Hugh Fitz Roy, who captained the H.M.S. Beagle on its first two voyages,



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including the 1831-36 Voyage around the world, made most famous by the writings of Charles Darwin.

Arrowsmith's map is perhaps the single most detailed atlas map of the period.
