



## **Description:**

Late state of Mount & Page's sea chart of Jamaica, from the *Fourth Book* of the *English Pilot*.

The chart was perhaps the single most widely utilized English sea chart of Jamaica during the first half of the 18th Century, as the success of the *English Pilot* gave it a dominant place in the Sea Atlas market, especially among English speaking mariners. Unlike many atlas maps, the *English Pilot* was used extensively at sea, and as such, the condition of the maps frequently reflects active use.

The map includes a large inset of Port Royal. Issued at a time when the English influence in the Caribbean was on the rise and the English and French were vying for regional supremacy, the chart is an excellent artifact of a period when Jamaica was one of the most important economic colonial forces in the British Empire.
